#### **Guess Who's No. 10??**



As of the most recent report by the Department of Transportation, there were 8,410,255 motorcycles registered in the United States by private citizens and commercial organizations in 2011. To put this staggering number into perspective, out of every 36 people you meet in the U.S., one of them probably has a motorcycle. For ranking purposes, we won't be looking at total bikes in a state, but rather people per motorcycle (the lower the number, the more common bikes are). So what states in America have the most die-hard moto-enthusiasts?

#### Louisiana drivers are the worst in America (rest of the South isn't so hot, either)

The study was conducted by CarInsuranceComparison.com and compiled five types of law-enforcement data:

- Fatality rate (per 100 million vehicle miles traveled)
- Failure to obey citations issued (traffic signals and seat belts)
- Drunk driving citations
- Number of tickets issued
- Careless driving citations

The data itself came from a range of sources, including the National Highway Traffic Administration and Mothers Against Drunk Driving. CarInsuranceComparison ranked each state in each category according to how well (or poorly) it performed, and then added the rankings to create a total score. For example, a state that ranked 32nd in careless driving citations and 14th in drunk driving citations would have a combined score of 46 for those two areas.

When all the dust settled, Louisiana had earned the dubious distinction of having the worst drivers in America. It might interest you to know that despite Louisiana's liberal alcohol policies, DUIs aren't the cause of its low rank. In fact, Louisiana "only" scored 38th (out of 51, including the District of Columbia) in rates of drunk driving arrests, but really hit bottom in failure-to-obey citations, tickets issued, and incidents of careless driving.

Whatever's wrong with Louisiana, it's catching, because the Bayou State's neighbors didn't fare too well, either. In fact, seven of the ten worst-ranked states are situated in the South. (Assuming we want to associate Texas with the South, which is a matter of some debate.) And so, without further ado, the states with the worst drivers are:

## 1. Louisiana 2. South Carolina 3. Mississippi 4. Texas 5. Alabama 6. Florida 7. Missouri 8. North Carolina 9. Montana 10. North Dakota

At the other end of the list—the good end—we find states that are generally farther to the north. The best of the bunch is Vermont, which boasts a higher-than-average number of drunkdriving incidents, but on every other metric, it's in the top ten. The states with the best drivers are:

51. Vermont 50. Utah 49. New Hampshire 48. Minnesota 47. Oregon 46. Maine 45. Connecticut 44. District of Columbia 43. Iowa 42. Massachusetts 41. Alaska

#### **Rationale & Caveats**

Can we draw any broad conclusions about America based on this study? As much as we love to be equal-opportunity finger-pointers, it's hard to ignore the fact that the worst-driving states fall largely in one southern cluster, while the betterdriving states lie mostly to the north.

But surely the disparity isn't related to weather—otherwise, why would Montana and North Dakota make the top-ten worst-driver list? The overlap doesn't seem to be alcohol-related, either—at least not among the most accident-prone segment of drivers—nor does it seem linked to licensing laws for teens. Frankly, the problem of bad driving seems most closely aligned with poverty rates, though even that isn't a perfect match.

Then again, maybe the clusters are a coincidence, or perhaps the study is inaccurate—something we've seen before and will likely see again. Methodology nerds could surely poke a few holes in the survey's backend, and our own experiences tell us that some states deserve slightly poorer rankings. Heck, Lindsay Lohan still roams the streets of California, and it's only ranked #19?

#### **Helmet Laws Making a Comeback**

Over the last year or so I have mentioned that the CDC (Center for Disease Control) seems to have wormed its way into the helmet debate. Most likely brought in by the same thinking folk that brought them into the gun control debate.

So what does this mean to us?

I just received this from the MRF.

The CDC community preventative services task force has released its findings statement on motorcycle safety. It's just as bad as we imagined it. I was supposed to speak to the CDC today but they postponed. I'll likely speak to them tomorrow to answer some questions about the report. One of the things I am to find out is where are all the studies they say they used? They claim to use data from 69 studies yet there are only 7 resources listed in the reference section. A full MRF release is in the works.

At this point there is no reason to panic, but I urge you to prepare for fight to get heated as we go into the next few years. This year is going to be a year, whether you like it or not, we will have to pay very close attention to the elections this November.

I nailed another deer, this time a big mulie, in the eastern Arizona mountains. Car still drove



#### Women Who Ride

Freud asked, "What does woman want?"

Harley-Davidson has the answer. She wants a motorcycle—or should. That is the result of a study of female motorcycle riders and non-riders, commissioned by the Wisconsin-based bike manufacturer.

Female riders were twice as likely as their nonriding counterparts to feel "confident." They were twice as likely, too, to feel "extremely satisfied" with their appearance. More than half of those

riders said the two-wheeled experience made them feel "free" and "independent." And while they were marginally less inclined to say they "usually feel good" about their senses of humor and intelligence, they were almost twice as likely to say they "usually feel good" about their sex appeal.

Harley-Davidson's director of women's outreach marketing, Claudia

Garber, is one of those female riders. She took up the sport six years ago with the purchase of a Harley Nightster and moved on to a Fatboy. "It's about freedom," the married mother of two says. "When you're doing things you want to do, for yourself, and you feel confident, it goes into every aspect of your life, including how you feel about yourself. You feel more comfortable in your skin."

More and more women are, in fact, riding. A 2012 study by the Motorcycle Industry Council found that women accounted for 12% of U.S. motorcyclists—up from 10.5% in 2009.

Veteran rider and motorcycle journalist Susanna Schick found the results of the new study consistent with her own experience. "I ride because I need the freedom," she said. "When I drive my car, I feel like a caged wild animal, trapped and forced to live within everyone else's limits."

The study, in which 1,013 riders and 1,016 nonriders were interviewed by the market research company Kelton Global, seems to bear that out. The results say female riders are happier in their careers, happier in their friendships, happier with their home lives, and twice as likely to

be "extremely satisfied" with their sex lives.

Uh, maybe, said Schick. "Being a woman in a man's sport means I meet loads of men who tell me how much they dig chicks who ride," she said. "Then they go home to their girlfriend or wife who doesn't—and [who] eventually talks them out of riding altogether. So there's a

real disconnect between the compliments I get and the reality. Having professional racers half my age flirt with me feeds my ego, but not my soul." Whatever their experience, the rise in women riders is working for Harley. The company is selling more motorcycles to women than all their competitors combined, says the company's Garber.
