Motorcycle Riders Foundation's Kirk 'Hardtail' Willard Recipient of Coveted Sturgis Freedom Fighter Award

WASHINGTON, DC - The Sturgis Motorcycle Museum Hall of Fame recently issued an announcement confirming the incoming class of the 2018 Hall of Fame-ers. Each year, the Sturgis Motorcycle Museum & Hall of Fame recognizes individuals or groups who have made a long-term, positive impact on the motorcycle community. This year's class is noteworthy and diverse featuring artisans and craftsmen, philanthropic organizations and several women; all who have made an impact in the world of motorcycling. However, this year, a special award category, designated as The Freedom Fighter Award, was identified. The recipient for 2018 is the Chairman of the Board of Directors and President of the Motorcycle Riders Foundation. Kirk "Hardtail" Willard.

Hardtail, as he is known in the motorcycle rights world, is spoken upon with the highest regard from riders representing all walks of life. From the aftermarket industry and original equipment manufacturers to the motorcycle clubs and state motorcycle rights' organizations, he is known as a force to be reckoned with. Logging thousands upon thousands of miles on his



motorcycles, his objectives have always stayed pure; to promote and preserve motorcycle riders' freedoms and lifestyle. He has done just this not only locally in his home state of Wisconsin, but nationally and internationally through his work with the Motorcycle Riders Foundation.

A Lengthy List of Accomplishments

His name is synonymous with the Motorcycle Riders Foundation; an organization of motorcycle rights activists directly responsible for the historic repeal of the federal government funding incentive for states to require a helmet to ride a motorcycle. Though Hardtail himself worked to steer the MRF and its supporters in their efforts to ban National Highway Traffic Safety Administration employees to lobby state governments to implement univer

sal protective gear laws. He worked tirelessly throughout the years, refuting EPA's "Color and Chrome" initiative which would only allow riders to make cosmetic changes to their bikes, but would affect their performance through emission control devices. Prior to his taking over as Chairman of the MRF Board of Directors, he helped voice support to establish (and eventually expand) the only national lobby and advocacy day for bikers in the nation's Capital.

Known as "Bikers Inside the Beltway" Hardtail helped to augment this yearly gathering into a highly anticipated powerhouse of an event, attracting hundreds of bikers from across the country to Washington, D.C. to meet with their elected officials. In recent years, the event has expanded, bringing rider education and training tools directly to the Capitol for lawmakers and staff to experience as well as plans to collaborate with the House Motorcycle Caucus this year in an event to recognize May as Motorcycle Awareness Month.

In more recent years, Hardtail's leadership and work on the federal highway transportation bill lead to provisions which ended all federal funding of motorcycle only



checkpoints which had been used as a way to target those who ride under the guise of "compliance checks." He was also one of the catalysts in resurrecting the Motorcyclist Advisory Council - a group of riders with a direct connection to the nation's top highway safety professionals to advise them on issues of importance to motorcyclists. And under his direction in 2017, bipartisan and bicameral legislation was introduced, recognizing and condemning instances of motorcyclist profiling and encouraging states to take action.

Accolades Across Aisles

Those who know him often compare his leadership style to that of President Theodore Roosevelt's mantra - to walk softly and carry a big stick. His tireless and relentless commitment to the motorcycle community has made an impression on his friends and colleagues including Dave Dwyer, who is a former Board Member of the Motorcycle Riders Foundation and active member of ABATE of Wisconsin; "I have traveled the country with Hardtail and I feel that there is nobody in the United States more deserving of inclusion in Sturgis Motorcycle Museum Freedom Fighters Hall of Fame than Kirk "Hardtail" Willard."

And in Willard's home state, the Executive Director of ABATE of Wisconsin Dave Charlebois said, "Not only has Hardtail given a significant amount of time and effort to the motorcycle rights movement at the local, state, and national levels, he has inspired and mentored leaders for decades and has selflessly ensured we remain strong and vigilant. I can think of no one more deserving of inclusion to the Sturgis Freedom Fighters Hall of Fame."

Even those not directly involved in the motorcycle rights world were aware of his affect on the motorcycle community. Former Member of Congress Reid Ribble, who represented the 8th district of Wisconsin from 2011-2016 said, "No one could be surprised by the news that "Hardtail" has been selected for the Sturgis Freedom Fighter Award. He regularly visited me while I served in Congress and was among the most effective advocates for the motorcycling

community that I ever worked with. He is a true champion of riders everywhere and this recognition is well deserved!"

Mr. Willard will be officially

inducted into the Hall of Fame at the 78th Sturgis Rally set for August 3-12, 2018. A breakfast and ceremony in honor of the inductees will take place at 9am on Wednesday, August 9. 2018 BIKERS INSIDE THE BELTWAY WRAP UP

The bar has been raised. Just a few weeks ago, congressional staffers and lawmakers started their morning with the sweet roar of motorcycles as the background music as they shuffled off to their offices. Almost 150 riders from across America made their way to the nation's capital on Tuesday, May 15. Scores of motorcycles parked directly in front of the Capitol as the biggest and best "Bikers Inside the Beltway" got underway.

This year's event wasn't your ordinary lobby day. Though thousands of advocates supporting different causes head to the Hill during the spring and summer months wearing coordinated hats, lapel pins, and name tags, bikers made their presence known by being themselves. Donning their leather, cuts, colors and riding their motorcycle, 150 bikers seemed like 1,500 bikers marching through the halls of Congress. This was a full-fledged campaign jam-packed with events.

This year's event started out with a communication to congressional staffers: "The Bikers are Coming to Town" that circulated throughout offices on Capitol Hill just days before the event. 2500 emails were sent outlining the event, identifying the issues that would be raised and an invitation to get to know us better. It set the stage as the bikes rolled in that Tuesday. Attendees quickly broke out into teams, gathered their materials and set out. Collectively, participants hit almost every office on the hill to drop off materials including issue briefs on profiling, ethanol, the RPM Act and self-driving cars (see lobbying materials below). However, it was the 169 actual face-to-face meetings that were scheduled which allowed time for a lengthy discussion on the issues. And this year, for the first time, a hand-picked "leadership" team met with the top influential members of the Democratic and Republican parties in both the House and Senate (see the photo of Majority Leader Mitch McConnell) to discuss the issues and ask for relief.

Through MRF A&E's generous support, the Congressional Motorcycle Caucus held an event featuring a virtual reality motorcycle riding experience that was presented by Stacey "Ax" Axmaker. Dozens of staffers attended as well as Members of Congress from Wisconsin and Texas. We capped the day by hosting a debrief and reception at the local American Legion where Congressman Tim Walberg from Michigan came by to address the crowd and receive his "MRF Legislative Champion of the Year" award.

And then the results of our efforts started pouring in. Within days the co-sponsors of the motorcycle profiling resolutions increased by 14% and that number continues to grow. The RPM Act added co-sponsors from Texas, Arizona and Missouri, bringing the total number of co-sponsors up to 149 in the House. And last but certainly not

They attended special meetings setup with the Speaker of the House and the party leads for the House and Senate. Although several attended the event last year, most did not actually lobby. This was a major milestone for the MRF and Bikers Inside the Beltway!

This year, the following issues were our top priorities when meeting with our legislators.


- Pass the RPM Act (S.203 and H.R.350)
- Make sensible changes to the Renewable Fuel Standard
- Co-Sponsor the Anti-Profiling Resolution (H.Res.318 and S.Res.154)
- Identify the AV START Act

(S.1885) as the only federal legislation that requires motorcycles as a component of the Safety Evaluation Report

Alaska had some additional bragging rights this year as we were the first state to have 100% of our delegation co-sponsor both the Anti-Profiling Resolution (H.Res.318 and S.Res.154) and the RPM Act (S.203 and H.R.350).

Thank you all for your support while I fight for your rights. Without your participation to contact your legislators, I would be unable to be as effective.

Motorcycle Safety class registration is now open for the 2018 rider education season! Basic and Experienced classes started the last weekend in April and continue through the entire summer, ending mid-September depending on weather.

There are classes to meet any and all of your motorcycling desires. Currently offered are three riding course classes and one introductory class. If it has been over 5 years since your last class it is time to take a refresher course.

- Kickstart Program Course for those needing a little more practice before taking the BRC Course. This course includes a training motorcycle and helmet if needed.
- Basic Rider Course (BRC)

Bike Blessing 2018

This year's Gathering at the Bike Blessing, on Saturday, May 5th, was a huge success. We expanded the event to use the entire Memorial Block of Park Strip. We had never done that before. The new layout and coordination with the City reduced impact to traffic around the area.

We estimate that 1,200 bikes 2,000 visitors participated.

This new layout now allows us more space to accommodate vendors with trailers and larger vehicles. It also allows space to include the Midnight Sun Street Rod association to participate. Six cars and trucks showed up with more to come next year. The commercial vendors participating this year included Alaska Leather, House of Harley, Team CC, Mad Hatter, Stan Tebow Allstate Ins., Steampunk Bling, Lund Video Editing, Dragon's Lash and Anchorage Yamaha.

And our food vendors continue to grow and change. This year we had Tiki Pete's Island Dogs cart, Holly Dogs cart, Lb4Lb BBQ Ribs and Catfish, Big Dogs Corndogs and

Glacier Bowl. We are always looking for new and different food vendors to add to the variety of offerings.

Of course the thirteen participating Motorcycle Clubs and Riding Groups are the backbone of the event. Lb4LB, STNMC, Biker's Life Church, BACA, Green Knights MC, HOG, Red & White Support, Red & White Fairbanks, Alaska Vets MC, Disciple Christian MC, CMA, Diamond Girls MC, and The Ascendants.

And we had several non-profits participating. AWAIC, Community Pregnancy Center, Art by Alex and Katie's Handprint.

Above all else we would like to thank Greg Porter for his magnificent job as MC and his continuing endorsement of Abate of Alaska. He has secured a permanent job as our MC for this event and we are proud to have him. We are looking forward to 2019 being even more exciting!

Unfortunately, the stereotype of the "criminal bitker" has been exacer-bated by television shows such as "Sons of Anarchy" that depict motorcyclists as dangerous and unlawful citizens, and responsible motorcyclists are suffering the con-sequences.
